Highlights of the 29th Grapeview Water & Art Festival, Chair, Marlee(Margaret) Campbell

"ANOTHER AWESOME YEAR"

Thanks to the creative planning, dedication, generosity, and hard work of the Festival Advisory Committee, the additional 180+ volunteers, and our generous co-sponsors and community partners together, we succeeded once again in achieving our goals of hosting "an old fashion community celebration for all ages and raising money to give back to the community".

Our biggest challenge this year, as always, is how to thank everyone who made this year's Festival possible. While it would take too much space to list the names of all the wonderful folks who lent a hand, below are highlights of the various venues and the chairs and teams for each. Appreciation to co-sponsors and community partners along with photos follow.

SELECTED HIGHLIGHTS:

- → Publicity: was over the top with the addition of a revised poster and first-time article in Fjord magazine and video by Explore Hood Canal (Jim Hanson, Chair & Team).
- → Art and Crafts: the number of carefully curated artists increased, and the resulting mix was as talented and popular, as ever, and eager to return (Julie & Mike Creighton, Co-Chairs & Team).
- → Logistics: Setup and Take-Down operations were recalibrated and tirelessly executed by a great team, and chief responsibility for planning and coordinating this critically component of the Festival was successfully transferred from the longstanding chairs -- thank you Kent Hillesland & Mike Fish -- to Ed White, Chair & Team.
- → Parking: went much smoother this year due to continued skilled coordination, Mason Transit providing 394 rides with two donated buses and drivers, and use of the Port of Grapeview gravel parking lot for all the artists (Lance Harpel, Chair & Team).
- → Ticket Sales: was well coordinated and also went more smoothly this year aided in part by paper menus for reference and three cash and one charge station (Christine Bal, Chair & Team).
- → Pavilion: was beautifully decorated with gorgeous floral arrangements by the Beachcombers Garden Club and superbly resourced & provisioned (Michele Hecht, Chair & Team).
- → Food Court: a combination of talented chefs and deft management, served up a delicious menu, with several items selling out before closing (Bonnie Townsley, Chair & Team).

- Children's Activities: art crafts and wooden boatbuilding were a big hit, featuring a new Fish Painting task sponsored by The Salmon Center in Belfair, and netting \$364 in tips from appreciative parents (Dianne Hanson & David Mueller, Co-Chairs & Teams).
- → Fishing Derby: drew it's loyal following of aspiring anglers, all of whom received prizes. (Debbie & John Black, Co-Chairs & Team).
- Gardening Table: morphed this year into an 'all ages' venue giving away almost 300 plants and seed packets and attracting lots of interest and questions (Macky McClung, Chair & Team).
- → Hole-in-One Golf: drew dozens of hopeful players of all ages and experience levels with first prize of a round of golf for 4 at Lakeland Village and second prize dinner for 2 at The Boat House (Edward Johnson, Chair & Team).

- Promotional Products: this year's T-shirt and sweatshirt 'whale' design was widely popular and made a record by selling out at Noon (Mary Larson, designer, & team).
- Additional Recognition: Music, Security, Trash Removal, and Restrooms all these additional critical operations were well-run, coordinated, and without incident -- thank goodness (Phil Stewart, Glenn Carlson, Maarten van Dijk, and Sandi Carlson, respective Chairs.)
